Ukrainian Exodus: refugees share their harrowing stories

Most of the Ukrainian refugees are women, children, and the elderly. More people stream into Poland, Romania, Slovakia, and Moldova with each passing day. Ukrainians have demonstrated extraordinary resilience, and neighboring countries have embraced them with a generosity not often granted.

However, more than one month into the conflict the resources of nearby countries are beginning to deplete. Through the generosity of its donors, CARE is working through partners in Poland, Moldova, Romania and Ukraine to provide immediate relief and aid in the form of food, shelter, blankets, diapers, and hygiene products as well as food, water, cash, and psychosocial support. All activities have a strong gender focus.

POLAND

A third-country national fears he will be separated from his family

Williams (pictured above) came from Ghana to study and then work in Ukraine, where he met his wife Airapetryan Sattennilc, 27. The couple has two young children, Martin, 7, and Richard, 1. Though they are now together in a Polish shelter in the town of Przemsyl, the family has already been separated once while trying to flee the Russian advance. Eventually they were reunited and were able to catch the Lviv-Pzermysl train across the Polish border.

Three generations of women find shelter in Sighet

Oleksandra, 81, her daughter Elena, 53, and granddaughter Vika, 22, sip hot tea in a safe shelter designed for disabled people established by CARE's Romanian partner, Star of Hope, at the Sighet border crossing. Oleksandra suffers from Type 2 Diabetes and completed the final leg of their journey to the border in a wheelchair provided by volunteers.
